

It has been an amazing turnover from last season for the 2nd grade side. 12month earlier we struggled to finish in 9th. This year Champions!

The start of the season was somewhat slow for the green men. Training numbers were down, and the season was on us before we knew it. Quite a few returning 2nd graders from the previous year and a few guys stepping up from the premierships winning 3rd grade team.

1st round we snuck away with a draw to Northern Power after a weather affected match only allowing play on day 2.

2nd round was again weather affected with a wet wicket at Fagans which we loss the toss, got sent in and rolled relatively easily. Then continue to play poorly and lost outright to Terrigal.

3rd round was the beginning of our unbeaten run. After winning the toss against Southern Spirit, the green men batted first and cruised to 228runs on an uneven Rogers Park wicket. A fantastic century to Mitch Coombs led the way. We then proceeded to bowl the southerners out with little resistance. Southern Spirit were all out for 137. Mitch Coombs pick of the bowlers with 4 for 19.

4th round vs Brisbane Water at Adcock Park. Chasing an outright the green men won the toss and sent them in and rolled them for 108. Pick of the bowlers Angus Jack with 3 for 29 and Mitch Coombs 3 for

15. The lions then went on the quick chase and passed them on the first day comfortably. Returning on day 2, we were all out for 195runs with Trent Scott 40runs, and Ray Gomez 38runs the best with the bat. With a sizeable lead the Lions went on the hunt for the outright. Again the boys were too good with the ball, with Brisbane Water all out for 111, with Angus Jack 3 for 26 and Trent Scott 3 for 15. Chasing 25 to win, the Lions cruised home losing 3wickets for the Outright Win.

5th round vs Lisarow, the Lions lost the toss and were bowling. After a slow start to the innings Lisarow batted well to get all out for 218. Unfortunately their number 11 batted well and got 56runs, otherwise we would have rolled them for a lot less. Wickets were spread amongst the bowlers with Grant Binns, Trent Scott and Jack Sinnott each taking 2 wickets. With only half a dozen overs left in day 1, we were in to bat and started poorly losing 2wickets before stumps. Returning the following week the boys were confident and keen to get a much needed win before the Xmas break. With Andrew Moseley leading the way with a wonderful 110runs, the Lions got the runs 8 down for the 1st innings win.

6th round vs Kincumber, and week 1 was washed out without a ball being played. On the commencement of day2, we lost the toss and were sent in on a wet soft wicket. A solid start from Koby Salter making 28 and solid partnership from James McDonald (31)and Mitch Coombs (70) put the Lions good position and all out for 179 off 53overs. Kincumber got off to a quick start however our bowlers tighten their lines and length and the wickets started to fall. At 8 for the tail hung on for the last 10overs of play and we were unlucky to not get a result (Draw). Best of the bowlers were Mitch Coombs 3 for 7, and Panashe Mudavose 2 for 6.

7th round vs The Entrance was similar the match before the rain played into the week 1 play, with no play happening. It was obvious the Entrance were abit scared of the Lions as the deck wasn't that bad, but they were not interested in starting play. The Lion proceeded to the Grange where we performed well. Day 2 was better with the Lions losing the toss and being sent into bat. I relatively poor batting. Performance from the team with nobody really troubling the scorers and the Lions were all out for 111 after 49 overs. With 31overs to go in day 2 play, the lions were looking to take early wickets and that's what happened. A great runout of their opener and KJ with a celebrity appearance taking 3 wickets. Like the previous week, the Lions had them in trouble, but couldn't finish the job with the tail hanging on to finish the day at 7 for 65 and another weather affected draw.

8th round vs Wyong and with the previous 2 matches drawn, the Lions needed an outright to try and cement a spot in the top 4. We lost the toss and Wyong batted first, which was what the Lions were looking for. It was a slow start. Their openers batted solidly the Lions pint down several chances. However, once the first wicket fell, they continued to fall, and Wyong were all out for 99. Wickets were spread between all the bowlers with Trent Scott taking 3, and Ryan Cox, Jack Sinnott and Mitch Coombs all taking 2 wickets each. We commenced the chase and lost a couple of wickets to end day 1 2 for 50ish. The Lions returned and made quick runs and declared 3 for 153 to try for the outright. Mitch Coombs with 77*. The Wyong team then proceed to play some painful cricket to say the least. The 2 openers blocked their way to a 2/230, and the Lions won 1st innings.

9th round vs Warnervale and the last round was important. The Lions were in 5th, with all the top 5 teams only losing 1 game each all year it was tight at the top. The Lions needed an outright win and other result to go our way to make the finals. We won the toss and decided to bowl, trying to roll them as quickly as possible. However, their openers had a different idea, both Warnervale openers batted well for an opening stand of 50+. It was a good test of the Lions character and patience. Binns brothers broke the early partnerships then Mitch Coombs demolished the rest! In an awesome bowling performance Mitch was on a hat trick 3 times and delivered a hat trick on the 3rd attempt, finishing with 8 wickets, and Warnervale all out for 123. The chase began well. Ryan Cox and Andrew Moseley with an outstanding partnership to pass their total well before the end of the day. The day finished at 1/181 with a century from Andrew Moseley, and an unbeaten 59 from Ryan Cox. Day 2 saw the Lions immediately declare and again the bowlers did a great job. Little resistance from Warnervale who were all out for 74. 2 wickets each to Grant Binns and Trent Scott and another 4 wickets to Mitch Coombs, taking his match figures to 12 for 39. The Lions chased down the 19 runs to get the outright win. We then awaited other results.

Semi Final- Lions (4) vs The Entrance (3)

After sneaking into the finals, the Lions were very confident heading into the finals, having not lost a match since round 2. We lost the toss and The Entrance chose to bat first. Enter Angus Jack! Returning from a long lay off from a broken finger, Angus was on fire early. Clean bowled 3 of the top 4 bats with some brilliant fast bowling, and with Mitch Coombs at the other end unplayable we were in the box seat early. The Entrance showed some resistance with Dane Stevenson batting well until Grant Binns got him. Then Trent Scott cleaned up the rest and the Entrance were all out for 116. Best of the bowlers were Angus Jack 3/23, Trent Scott 3/7 and Grant Binns 2/15. Chasing 117 for the win, the boys started well with the end of day 1 finishing at 1/34. The Lions returned on day 2 needing 90 odd runs for a win, and the young guns continued the solid start from day 1 with Ryan Cox (26) and Jake Duncan (21). Then Mitch Coomb (43*) and the Binns brothers brought in home for victory with a 6 wicket Win.

Preliminary Final- Lions (4) vs Terrigal (1)

After a sensational semi final win the previous week, the Lions were again super confident heading into the prelim final against the minor premiers Terrigal. After winning the toss we decided to bowl on a flat deck and a fast outfield. Some thought this was a mistake but the Lions with few old blokes tend to fade into the Sunday generally with tight hamstrings and bad back. The decision proved the right one with Mitch Coombs destroying the top order with 2 wickets in the first 3 balls of the first over! Then Aug Jack got another wicket, then Mitch Coombs another 2 wickets and Terrigal were 5 for 20 odd after 10 overs. Following that the bowling attack stayed patient, Terrigal got a couple of chances and had a 60 odd run 7th wicket partnership before Angus Jack returned with another 2 wickets and Grant Binns with 2 wickets to clean out the tail and Terrigal were all out for 113. Mitch Coombs 4/23. Angus Jack 3/24 and Grant Binns 2/3. Chasing 113 for victory, the Lions got off to a horrible start. 3 quick wickets including our top run scorers Andrew Moseley and Mitch Coombs and the Lions were going to need to fight hard. A solid 4th wicket partnership between Jake Duncan (35) and James McDonald (42) steadied the chase and the Lions were back on track. Another solid partnership between James McDonald, and Grant Binns got the lions home and then proceeded to bat until the Bellbirds conceded. Another fantastic Win to the Lions and a berth in the Grand Final.

Grand Final- Lions (4) vs Kincumber (2)

After another comprehensive win the previous win the Lions went into the Grand Final again full and confidence and probably the favourites. Again, the Lions won the toss and decided to bowl first and like the previous 2 wins if proved again to be the right call for the skip. The opening bowling partnership were both on fire again. Mitch Coombs taking 2 early wickets and Angus Jac another, followed by another from Brad Binns and Kincumber were 4 for 20 odd. A little resistance from the middle order, but it was short lived. The Lions attack was relentless. The entire attack bowled beautiful lines and length with patience and the wickets continued to fall. The Lions fielding was outstanding! All chances were taken and the boys were buzzing with the slips cordon on fire! Kincumber were all out for 68! Bowling figures- Mitch Coombs 4/26, Angus Jack 1/11, Brad Binns 1/02, Grant Binns 2/6, Jack Sinnott 1/13 and Panashe Mudavose 1/10. 3 catches to Brad Binns in the slips. The small chase began solid, with Andrew Moseley (10) and Ryan Cox (15) making starts before being dismissed then Jake Duncan (1) missed out and the Lions were 3 for 50 odd with the target in sight and passed just after tea on day 1. With the goal now to pile on the runs and bat for as long as possible, the boys batted brilliantly. 4th wicket partnership between Brad Binns (24) and Mitch Coombs with a sensational chanceless (109) really put the Lions in a commanding position towards the end of day one. At the end of day 1 the Lions were 7 for 182 and in total control.

On the commencement of day 2 the plan was simple. Bat as long as possible, however things didn't go to plan. The Lions loss 3 wickets in 2 overs without adding to the overnight score to be all out for 182 with a 1st inning lead of 114 runs.

Kincumber elected to continue in hope of a miracle outright win, so the lions were back at it with the ball. It was HOT! 36deg HOT and the old fellas were going to struggle. We knew they were going to chase quick runs so the plan was simple, be patient and continue to do what we had in the previous 2 months and bowl good spots. Kincumber were off to a flyer, but it was short lived with Angus Jack getting the edge to a juggling catch in first slip by Brad Binns. Quickly followed by another clean bowled wicket from Angus Jack and the Lions were on top again. Another wicket from Jack Sinnott and the tight bowling at

one end from Mitch Coombs was forcing Kincumber to push against the other end and the result was wickets from the Lions. Kincumber steadied the ship and build a solid 3 rd wicket partnership following

Mitch Coombs with a hamstring injury and Grant Binns with a quad injury the old Lions were struggling in the heat. The young Lions however were strong. A great catch in the slips again by Grant Binns off Brad Binns got the dangerous Daniel Nugent and then another good catch at square leg by Angus Jack off Brad Binns the Lions had 5 wickets to get for the victory. Another steady 5th wicket partnership by Kincumber got them to level pegging with the Lions for the match. Enter the Lions spin king Trent Scott. Bowling tight lines with majesti flight the man took 4 of the last 5 wickets including the important wicket of Liam Roache. A tough day in the field for the Lions with multiple injuries (to the old fellas), in stinking hot weather and down 2 bowlers. It was the story of the Lions season. Everyone chipped in and did their part. Kincumber were all out for 187, and with 30 overs to go the Lions need to bat the rest of the overs out, or get the runs, and in typical style the team wanted to chase them down!

Bowling figures- Mitch Coombs 0/19, Angus Jack 2/57, Jack Sinnott 2/40, Brad Binns 2/20, Panashe Mudavose 0/16 and Trent Scoot 4/33. 3 catches to Andrew Moseley. The 73 run chase was on and unfortunately Ryan Cox (1) got a ripper and was out early. The Lions then proceeded to do it in style with Jake Duncan (39) and Andrew Moseley (28*) getting the score to 1/71, before Jake was dismissed and giving Mitch Coombs (4) the chance to come in and hit the winning runs with a beautiful lofted off drive for 4 runs to bring up the Outright Wing for the premiership to Narara Wyoming Lions.

Final Words

Special mention to a number of players that contributed to the premiership winning season for the Lions. Adam Walsh, Ray Gomez, Koby Slater, Anthony Hanna, Stuart Owen and Dean Mills (12 th man). These guys performed outstanding through the year and it was tough for selector all year.

IT has been one of the most enjoyable seasons of my career. As the captain it was important for me that the team had fun, first and foremost. We had the opportunity to have a number of senior players including James McDonald, Grant Binns, Andrew Moseley, Mitch Coombs and myself that were all on board to drive a tight ship that got the balance between keeping it fun and keeping each other accountable to perform. The young Lion cubs had come on in leaps and bounds this year. I have had the privilege of playing with these young men for a number of years now and their talent as always been there, however this year with the help of a strong senior playing group they have all shown their fighting spirit and tough competitive natures. The future is bright for the Lions and I hope than they have enjoyed the season as much as the old fellas have. I look forward to seeing these young men dominate 1 st grade in years to come.

I would also like to thank the executive and committee. I had the privilege to be part of this wonderful group this year and I am thankful for these wonderful people in our club and the work they do is extraordinary.

I am privileged to have captained this premiership winning Lions team and look forward next year and defending our title.

and other commitments we relied on players from other grades and girls from the youth league and sixers team to help us make it onto the pitch each week. We often played with only 7 players but even when we knew it was going to be hard, everyone gave 100% effort and had a lot of fun!

In all bar the last 2 games, we batted out our 20 overs and managed 2 close wins!

While it was a disappointing end for our Third Grade squad falling short in the grand final; what a great season for the Lions overall!

Congratulations to Brad Binns and the Men's Second XI for winning the premiership from 4th position, Gareth Walsh and the Men's Masters team for taking out the Club's inaugural Over 40's title and, finally, to the Female Youth League side for winning their third consecutive premiership! There were many other strong performances with several teams making the finals.

We started off the season in fine fashion, washed out in Round 1 on the verge of an easy victory (Northern Power) followed by three resounding victories (Wyong, Lisarow & Kincumber). We then suffered a comprehensive defeat to the team that would become ours and all teams' nemesis for the remainder of the season (The Entrance). We then strung together five consecutive wins – three dominant (Terrigal, Southern Spirit and Northern Power) and two 'snatch victory from the jaws of defeat' results (Wyong and Lisarow). We lost a tight one against Kincumber to end 2022 and then got sent packing by The Entrance to resume 2023. We got back on track with a solid win over Terrigal and then a fantastic chasing win over Southern Spirit with four junior fill-ins. We smashed Northern Power and Wyong for the third time each before Lisarow got one back on us. We finished off the year with a strong win against Kincumber to secure second spot on the ladder behind undefeated The Entrance. The other two semi-finalists were the only other two teams we'd lost games against during the season.
